# ACTIVITY PLAN

# **1. Make a newspaper collage of natural disasters on a frame of tree / bear.**

Collecting newspaper reports relating to natural disasters and pasting it as collage in the chart cut in the form of tree/bear will help children to improve their reading skills. Students will also develop interest to read newspaper reports and gather information.

#### 2. Collecting information on the usefulness of forests

Students will gather information from Internet/books/newspapers and paste pictures and write the usefulness of forests in an A4 sheet/chart paper. Students will discover the need to plant more trees and protecting forest as a natural resource.

## 3. Speaking about natural calamities

Students will be asked to listen to news as well as read newspaper reports and prepare a speech relating to natural calamity and speak in front of the classroom. This will enhance the confidence of the student as well as communicative skills.




There are a few great books to help your students understand natural disasters.
